
- All CPUC jurisdictional load serving entities must file an IRP with the CPUC every two years
- 2020 IRP consists of a narrative template, resource data template, and clean system power calculator (GHG calculator) showing planned energy and capacity resources through 2030
- Plans are assessed for reliability, greenhouse gas emissions, and local air pollutant minimization in disadvantaged communities
- Two plans wills be required, consistent with a statewide GHG emission limit for the electric sector for 2030 of 46 MMT and a lower limit of 38 MMT


- Reference System Portfolio
  - CPUC's Reference System Portfolio (RSP) represents the optimal (least cost) mix of resources to reliably meet electric sector's GHG emissions targets
  - CPUC modeling has identified the statewide Reference System Portfolio for the 46 MMT target and an alternative portfolio that would achieve a 38 MMT target
  - Both include large amounts of new solar, wind, and battery storage resources, as well as long-duration storage and out-ofstate wind on new transmission


#### **Cumulative Resources in RSP**

- June 18, 2020 CEA Board received report regarding financing options
  - River City Bank selected as preferred option
  - JP Morgan
- Funding Need:

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$1,000,000 Funding for FY 20/21 Operating Budget

$450,000 Repayment of Initial Advances to Member Agencies

$500,000 CAISO Deposit

$2,500,000 Lockbox Reserves and Cash Flow

$4,450,000 Total Funding needed
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- River City Bank
  - ~ \$105,000 lower interest/costs than JP Morgan
  - Requires Security from Member Agencies
    - Cash Collateral
    - Guaranty
  - Pro Rata Guaranty by Agency

CARLSBAD	90%	\$2,250,000
DEL MAR	3%	\$75,000
SOLANA BEACH	7%	\$175,000

- Requested Members to consider Guaranty
  - July 8 Solana Beach Authorized Guaranty
  - July 20 Del Mar Authorized Guaranty
  - July 14 Carlsbad considering an alternative
    - Provide Funding Needed
    - Carlsbad City Council considering terms July 28
    - Would need to come back to CEA Board to Authorize financing from Carlsbad

- Benefits to CEA of Carlsbad Option:
  - Reduced costs related to elimination of loan fees charged by both banks;
  - Lower interest rate terms (possibly Carlsbad Treasurer's Avg Yield + 1%);
  - Cash flow benefit of annual interest payments vs monthly with banks
  - Streamlined process for executing the loan agreement and drawing down the funds.
