The purpose of the CAC is to advise the CEA Board of Directors on those matters concerning the operation of its Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) program as directed by the Board of Directors in an annual workplan for the CAC that is adopted by the Board The objectives of the CAC are to provide feedback to the Board, act as a liaison between the Board and the community and serve as a forum for community input on those matters assigned to the CAC in the annual workplan. The CAC shall not have any decision-making authority but will serve as an advisory body to the Board of Directors.

While these experiences give me an appreciation for all elements in the proposed CAC work plan, including community outreach and social equity, probably my primary contribution to the committee would be my expertise in the field of renewable energy, coupled with a deep understanding of the physics that govern the electric power grid.

Describe any relevant background in or expertise related to one or more of the following fields: electricity, community outreach or engagement, or policy advocacy.

Electricity: I have a bachelor's and PhD in Electrical Engineering, the latter from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where my 1982 thesis in the Electric Power Systems Engineering Laboratory was focused on residential energy storage. I worked full-time for 30 years in silicon photovoltaic solar power technology, leading R&D teams that developed the solar panels that are now extensively deployed worldwide.

Community Engagement: Shortly after moving to Solana Beach in 2016, I was appointed to the city's Climate Action Commission and was reappointed this year. The Commission advises City Council on matters related to its Climate Action Plan, including community outreach.

Policy Advocacy: In 2018, I volunteered more than 100 hours to help get Mike Levin elected to the U.S. Congress, motivated by his advocacy for clean-energy policies.

Do you have any interests or associations that might present a conflict of interest? If yes, please explain:

I own the solar PV system on the roof of my house, and its associated battery storage.

The system generates more energy than I consume, so I would personally benefit from policies that compensate utility customers for supplying excess clean energy to the grid, or that reward residents who utilize on-site battery storage to assist with load leveling.

I am retired, but occasionally receive compensation for consulting related to solar power, primarily evaluation of funding proposals for the U.S. Department of Energy.

I am not aware of any other interests that might present a perceived conflict of interest.

What do you hope to accomplish as a member of the Clean Energy Alliance Community Advisory Committee?

The rolling blackouts in August affected the Solana Energy Alliance, demonstrating that just because a CCA has contracted for enough kWh's of energy does not guarantee that the power will be available when needed. A related misunderstanding arises over the meaning of 100% renewable power. The commercial organizations that support and advise municipal CCAs are naturally reluctant to represent the full complexity of supplying power on a minute-by-minute basis. I hope to be able to help the CEA Board by providing an independent assessment of the various energy-supply options available, so the Board can better understand the implications of their decisions. My input may help the Board avoid missteps on the path to a renewable future, missteps that critics (including those with a vested interest in fossil fuels) could use to frustrate CEA's effort to supply clean energy.
